Allegations of misconduct with minors are reported as the law requires and an internal investigation is conducted.

A complaint of misconduct may be reported directly to civil authorities. In addition, a complaint may be reported to the Diocese of Mobile by calling (251) 434-1559.

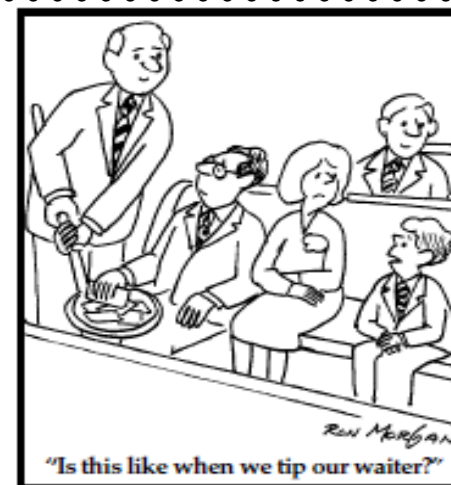
